




VISION

To create a thriving Gladstone community where Autistic and Neurodivergent individuals and their families are empowered, included, and celebrated. By nurturing understanding, advocating right-based frameworks, breaking down barriers, and championing neuro-affirming approaches, we envision a future where diversity is embraced as a strength and every individual has the opportunity to flourish.

MISSION

To empower and support Autistic and Neurodivergent individuals and their families within the Gladstone Region by nurturing inclusion, understanding, and opportunities for growth through community engagement, advocacy, and neuro-affirming programs tailored to diverse needs.

VALUES

1. Empathy and Inclusion: Nurture acceptance and understanding of Autism and Neurodivergence across the community, celebrate diversity and strive to create spaces where all individuals feel valued, respected, and supported.
2. Equity and Accessibility: Advocate for barrier-free access to education, employment, and cultural opportunities.
3. Collaboration: Partner with local organizations, schools, community members and stakeholders to achieve shared goals.
4. Empowerment & Autonomy: Support neurodivergent individuals in leading initiatives, independence, contributing to community decision-making, advocate for autonomy and the right of Autistic & Neurodivergent individuals to live fulfilling lives.
5. Community: We build strong networks of support, nurturing understanding and collaboration within and beyond our region.
6. Innovation: We embrace adaptive and creative approaches to address the unique and individual needs of our Autistic & Neurodivergent community.
7. Neuro-affirming: Champion the strengths, interests, and abilities of Autistic and Neurodivergent individuals, promoting positive self-identity and self-acceptance. Encourage practices and policies that respect and validate unique experiences, ensuring Autistic & Neurodivergent voices and perspectives are central to any discussions relating to them.





GRANN GOALS & FRAMEWORKS

STRATEGIC GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Advocacy and Awareness Objective: Increase public understanding of Autism & Neurodivergence, and challenge misconceptions. Strategies: Host community workshops on autism and neurodivergence. Conduct public awareness campaigns, leveraging social media and community events. Engage with policymakers to influence neuro-affirming policies.

Inclusive Community Programs Objective: Partner with community to co-design accessible initiatives that meet the unique needs of Autistic & Neurodivergent individuals and their families. Strategies: Offer peer-led support groups and educational resources. Establish creative and interest-based workshops such as art programs and leadership development. Address community sensory needs by providing accommodation options at events.

Building Partnerships Objective: Strengthen collaborations to enhance resource delivery and community engagement. Strategies: Collaborate and partner with various local businesses, institutions, mentors, to create 'life-choice' pathways for Autistic & Neurodivergent individuals. Collaborate with educational institutions to promote neuro-affirming learning environments. Develop inter-agency networks for resource sharing and referrals.

Leadership and Sustainability Objective: Ensure GRANN's long-term impact through effective governance and sustainable practices. Strategies: Expand long-term membership and volunteer base. Secure ethical funding through grants, sponsorships, and partnerships. Establish a hub to centralize resources and provide support tailored to local needs. Establish a Social Enterprise to build capacity and autonomy of Autistic & Neurodivergent community and champion individual needs.

IMPLEMENTATION FRAMEWORK

Year 1 -2 (2024-5)

- Conduct community information and advocacy sessions.
- Pilot peer groups (e.g., art, networking, social meets) for autistic and neurodivergent participants.
- Develop partnerships with organisations and businesses for neuro-affirming initiatives.

Year 2-3 (2025-6)

- Implement groups and programs focused on inclusivity and shared-interests.
- Build a robust volunteer network and promote the interests of Autistic & Neurodivergent individuals.
- Co-design GRANN workshops to deliver to community.
- Develop a resource hub to connect individuals and families to services.
- Establish a Social Enterprise to help achieve the aims above.

Year 3-4 (2026-7)

- Scale successful programs to a wider audience.
- Introduce 'life-choice' pathway opportunities for Autistic and Neurodivergent community.
- Expand partnerships with organisations and businesses for neuro-affirming initiatives.
- Review and adapt strategic goals based on community feedback and impact evaluation.

Join a growing group of community members working together to build a culture of care within our community and a diverse sense of belonging in the region; working together towards established common goals and celebrating our authentic selves.




